

School Development Plan – Outcome

- Outcome 2: Through the intentional design of the learning environment, students will improve their clarity when expressing their ideas in writing in Spanish or English, within a culture of well-being.

- Small group targeted instruction to address
- needs of students 'at risk' in literacy and numeracy

School Development Plan – Actions

Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions:

Provide access to an inclusive learning environment through responsive teaching and culturally diverse resources.

- Using translanguaging strategies across disciplines (dual language texts, personal dictionaries, co-created word walls, revoicing) to make complex topics comprehensible
- Engage all learners through the design of tasks that provide multiple entry points and reduce barriers for sharing understanding
- Intentionally design tasks that activate spirit, heart body and mind




